

What to bring and what not to bring

This is to try to help students when they are getting ready to move to halls and University for the first time what items are needed for their accommodation.

Items to bring:

Anything to make you feel like you are at home whilst at University

- Bedding: pillowcases, sheets, duvet with cover
- Towels
- Coat hangers
- Stereo, including ear phones
- Crockery and cutlery, saucepans and kitchen, utensils (except Clive Booth Postgraduate Centre)
- Air-tight containers for food
- Passport photos
- TVs are allowed but you will need to buy a TV licence

There are also some items which are not allowed in halls due to health and safety which are shown below.

Items NOT to bring:

- Expensive Bike (unless adequately insured)
- Candles, joss sticks, incense, Hubble pipes, any naked flame burner, barbeques
- Guns (including toy or replicas), knives, swords (including ceremonial), or any other offensive weapon
- Pets of any type
- Furniture including inflatable furniture or beanbags
- Curtains
- Training Weights
- Beer brewing kits
- Heating appliances, cooking equipment, fridges, freezers
- Cube adaptors
- DJ mixing decks, guitar amplifiers, drum kit or larger speakers
- Fairy Lights
- Plug-In Air freshener

Please note: Small electrical kitchen appliances may only be used and stored in the kitchen and must not be used in your bedroom or any other area. NO flammable liquids are to be stored anywhere in hall.

Self-catered kitchens included – kettle, microwave, oven, fridge/freezers, cupboards, ironing board, hoover. Irons are available to loan from hall office.
