Brief Overview

The Chartered Surveyor – Real Estate apprenticeship is a five year course which develops the behaviours and skills required for a career as a chartered surveyor. The BSc (Hons) degree is completed over four years and successful graduates will then be immediately ready to complete the End Point Assessment (EPA). This is the Royal Institute of Chartered Surveyors (RICS) Assessment of Professional Competence (APC). Successful completion of the APC secures full Chartered Surveyor designation.

Who is it for?

Trainee surveyors in real estate and property management settings.

Learning outcomes

- BSc Hons Real Estate and the RICS Assessment of Professional Competence (APC)

Entry requirements

- Level 3 qualification in a related subject. For those holding a full level 3 qualification (e.g. 3 A Levels, a BTEC Extended Diploma or Access to HE Diploma) we would typically be looking for candidates to achieve 112 UCAS tariff points
- English and Maths Level 2 equivalent to GCSE grade C or 4 or above.

End Point Assessment

- An interview
