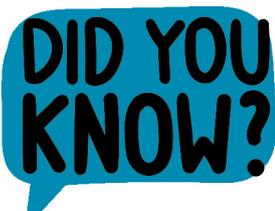

## SPRING CLEANING! MAKING MOODLE ACCESSIBLE

In September 2019, the government stipulated **accessibility regulations** for all public sector websites. Brookes established the cross-Directorate Accessibility Working Group who have worked hard to prepare our website to meet those regulations. They are now focused on **preparing Moodle to meet the regulations**. As many more people contribute to the development of Moodle courses than to our website the approach necessarily focuses on enabling the large community of Moodle users to review, learn, and update their practices.

**What's new?** The new **Brookes Accessibility Checklist** offers simple instructions on how to prepare teaching and learning materials to meet the regulations. The new **Digital Accessibility Guidelines (Self-Directed) Moodle Course** is designed to get you working with live documents and presentations and see how to check if materials are accessible and then, crucially, to give you practice in fixing any errors. The checklist and course are recommended for academic and professional services staff that create pages or documents for use by students. Finally, over the summer, we will install the Moodle plug-in, Blackboard Ally. This automatically makes files available in multiple, alternative formats for students and, for staff, displays an easy 'traffic-light' system of accessibility.

### Accessibility is based on 4 design principles

- 1 **Perceivable** Can everyone recognise and use your content and service with the senses they have?
- 2 **Operable** Can everyone find and use content even when accessing it in different ways, such as via a keyboard or voice commands?
- 3 **Understandable** Can everyone understand your content and the service you are offering?
- 4 **Robust** Can the content be interpreted reliably by assistive technologies?

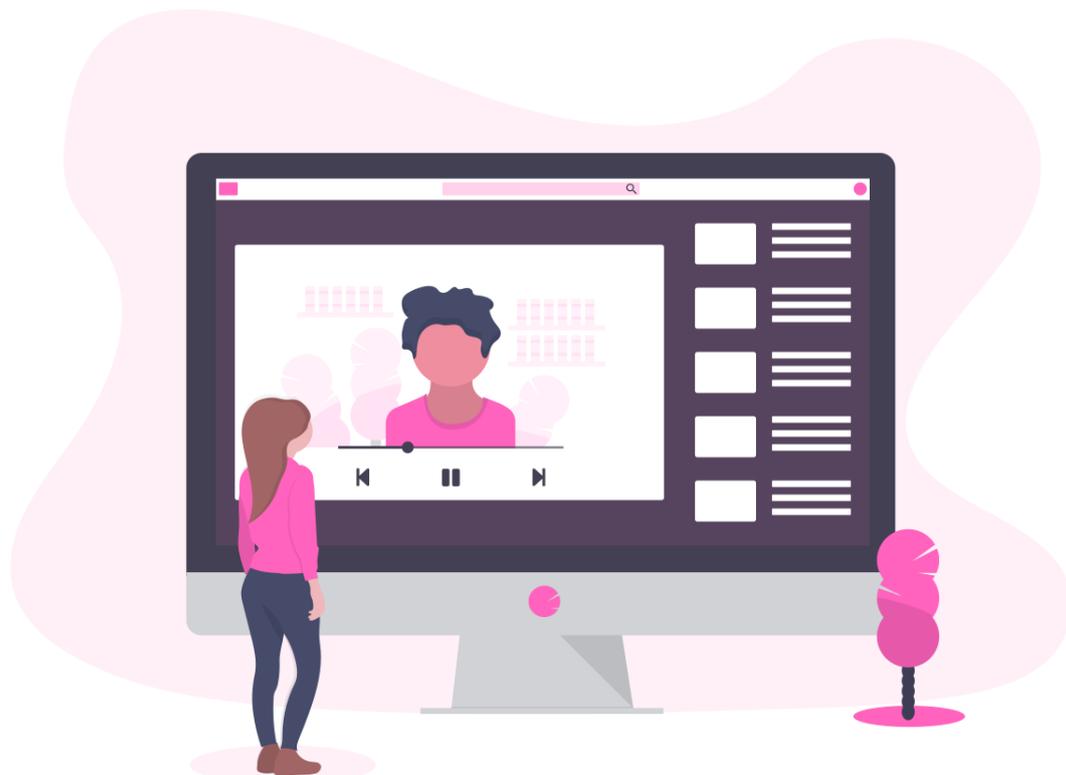

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## PDR 2020 IS CONTEXT EVERYTHING?

Performance Development Review is the Brookes process to enable staff to be effective in their roles and to support them to achieve their personal, professional, and career ambitions. Managers and their staff meet all year to discuss and shape work objectives and to learn together how best to meet priorities. At this time of year the process involves a more structured discussion, recorded on the annual PDR form. For reviewing managers it's a **time to really listen and understand their staff's aspirations and needs**. Undertaking the annual PDR discussion while working remotely may offer some new challenges but there are potentially real benefits from taking time to reflect on and share your journey over the last year, and specifically the most recent three months. The need for a conversation about expectations, priorities, and learning needs is also timely. **We have all had to learn quickly** a range of technical and soft skills to continue to work remotely and we're all aware that whatever the future holds at work, there will be a 'new normal' rather than a return to old ways. We'll **all need to learn and be supported into the future**. It seems this year's context for PDR might just help us get right back to basics with our development conversations.

# A SUMMER OF TEACHING SUPPORT AND DEVELOPMENT FROM THE OCSLD

Like many others, OCSLD colleagues have been working to consider how we can best prepare for teaching in 2020/21. Guidelines have been shared by Anne-Marie Kilday and more work is underway to develop a framework that will guide programme teams' preparations and describe key features of effective flexible, hyflex or blended learning. The OCSLD is already working closely with the Teaching and Learning Community, Digital Services and DMeLDs to update and extend the guidance on using Moodle; we will make sure it addresses the needs of teaching staff next academic year. We're also introducing two new formats for staff learning over the next two months. Both sustain a clear focus on inclusion by design.

## THE INCLUSIVE DIGITAL TEACHER (SELF-DIRECTED) MOODLE COURSE

Launching in mid-June, this comprises **five, one-hour learning bites** using and modelling features available in Moodle for **asynchronous** learning. You can complete as many of the five topics as you like, in any order, with no limit of when you access it. Programme teams may find it especially useful to do this course together to share learning and apply this to their programme as part of planning and preparation for teaching in 2020/21.

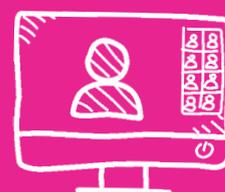
