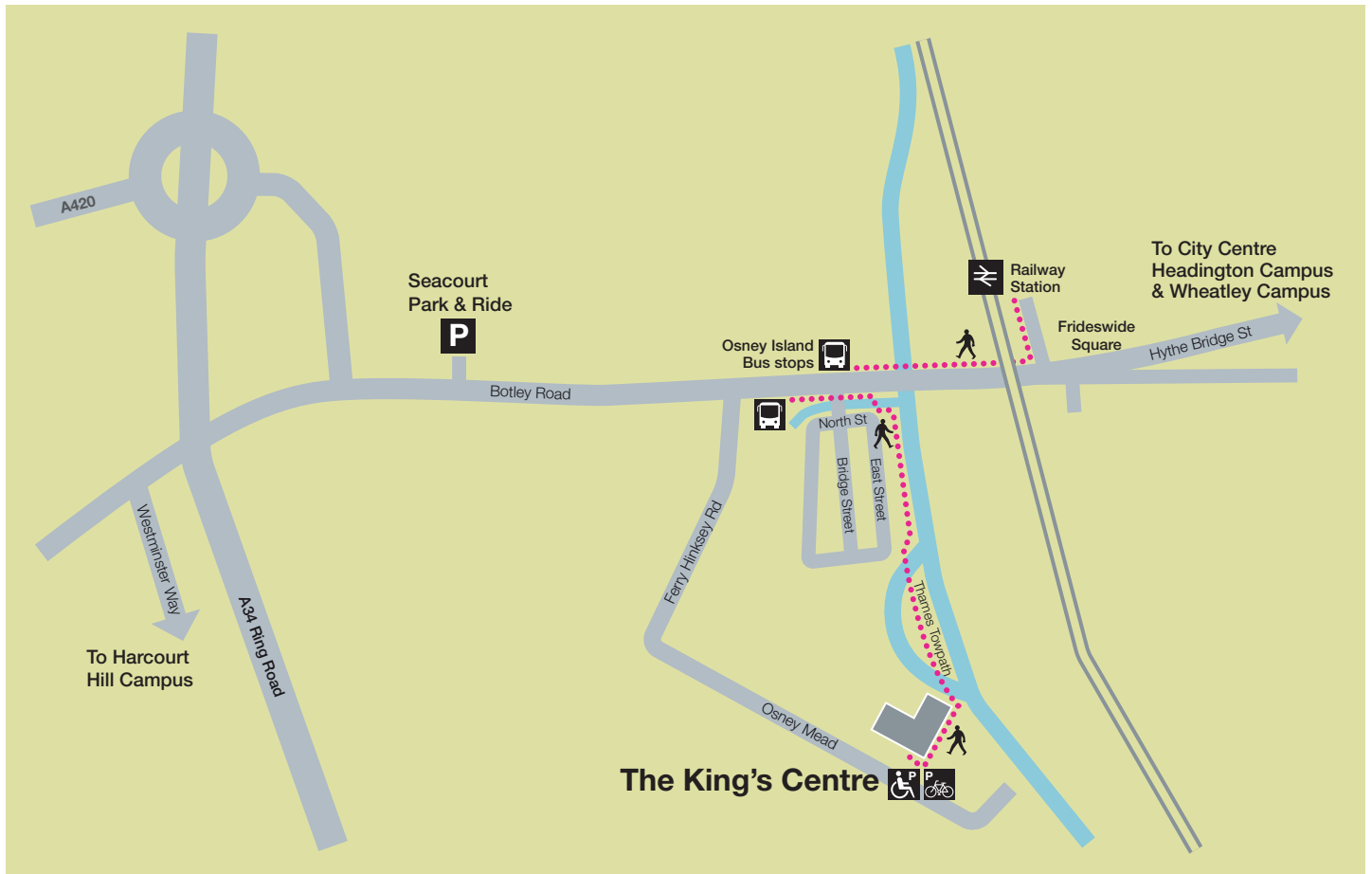


HOW TO GET TO THE KING'S CENTRE

Osney Mead, Oxford, OX2 0ES



BY BUS

Brookes 'Exam Buses' will run directly to the King's Centre from Headington and Wheatley Campus. See website for details.

Alternatively the nearest bus stop to the centre is the Osney Island stop on Botley Road, from where it is just a 5-10 minute walk along the Thames towpath. Botley Road is served by a variety of local buses - you can get on the U1 or any number 4 or S1.



BY RAIL

The King's Centre is just a 10-15 minute walk from Oxford rail station, via the Thames towpath.



CYCLING

The King's Centre provides undercover and secure bicycle racks for visitors. If you cycle round Oxford or would like to bring your bike on the train, the King's Centre is next to the Thames towpath, which is suitable for bicycles.



BY CAR - USE PARK & RIDE

The nearest Park and Ride is at Seacourt, just off the A34 Botley Interchange. Buses run every 15-20 minutes. You will need to get off at the Osney Island bus stop on Botley Road, from where the King's Centre is just a 5-10 minute walk along the Thames towpath.



WALKING

If you live in Oxford and prefer to walk, the King's Centre can be accessed by the Thames towpath from Folly Bridge or Osney Island.



There are some accessible parking spaces available at The King's Centre.
