Promotion to Senior Lecturer

Prior to submitting your application, we recommend that applicants:

Teaching and Learning

- Undergraduate/postgraduate level teaching including tutorial sessions, project supervision and dissertation support.
- External student activities that contribute to the student learning experience.
- Curriculum redesign and development, course accreditation and other quality assurance processes, keeping up to date with pedagogic developments.
- Student performance, progression and assessment at a faculty and University level, as well as externally e.g as an Advisor.
- Initiatives that enhance student experience (e.g PESE projects).
- Pastoral care.

Research and Knowledge Exchange

- A significant subject, professional and/or pedagogic research.
- Research funding bids and any grant awards.
- Dissemination of research through refereed publications and/or other appropriate methods.
- Consultancy or other knowledge exchange.
- Supervision of PhD students or a research team/project
- Impact case studies.

Liaison and Networking

 Networking with faculty or university committees, and external organisations to both develop, as well as maintain a strong involvement in your field.

This could include areas such as student recruitment, research funding, collaborations or consultancy.

Teamwork, Motivation and Managing People

- Leading modules and/or programme teams, and subject co-ordination.
- Ensuring productive and effective working relationships with academic and administrative colleagues.
- The development of projects at a faculty, department or subject area level.
- Integrating ALs and non-core staff into teaching, learning and other job-related activities.
- Leading modules and/or courses, ensuring that the planned quality of teaching and learning is successfully achieved.
- Supervising work completed by colleagues as part of a research team, project group or for PHD students.
- Supporting, advising and coaching colleagues using your knowledge and experience.
