

Rolling out RDAPs: Teaching Observations at Oxford Brookes

Oxford Brookes is committed to providing all HE teaching staff with high-impact academic CPD. As part of this, we're rolling out **Reflective Dialogues in Academic Practice (RDAP)**, our teaching observation protocol designed to support continuous enhancement and teaching excellence.



From Semester One, Model 1 (Quality Assurance and Enhancement) will be adopted across all Degree Apprenticeship programmes, with Model 2 (Quality Enhancement) rolling out incrementally to all programmes by 2027. Our goal is for all staff involved in teaching and learning to engage annually.

Academic Practice: tools, resources, and drop-ins Copilot tips to help in your teaching, learning, and productivity

The following are ideas and suggested prompts to use with Copilot. Oxford Brookes students and staff have access to the data-secure Microsoft Copilot Al chatbot, available through a Microsoft academic institutional licence.

When using Microsoft Co-pilot, signing in with your Oxford Brookes login ensures your data is protected, in accordance with Microsoft's privacy notice. However, we do not recommend you upload any confidential or protected data or information.



Tip 6, November 2025 - Use AI to generate relevant ice breakers

Ask Copilot to generate some ideas for icebreakers for your specific course. For example "Generate some ice breaker activities for a primary education university course" use these to generate discussions between students whilst staying relevant to your topic. You can take this further by asking how these can be used as a hook for the lesson topic, be used in an online session, or asynchronously through moodle.



Think Space workshops continue throughout November with sessions including *Using* spreadsheets for data analysis, Harvard referencing, Presentation skills, and Getting started with AI, among many others. A key value of this initiative so far, however, has been around generating awareness of the variety of regular opportunities there are for our students to meet



other people and experience not just belonging, but mattering. Some of these regular events are listed on the <u>Think Space website</u> and it is worth being aware of their existence.

The Centre for Academic Development is keen to collaborate with colleagues across the university in the strategic embedding of academic literacies development into programme content through our <u>departmental language</u>, <u>literacies and skills programme</u>. Semester 2 may seem a long way off but the deadline for semester 2 requests for CAD input is Friday 28 November, so if you would like our involvement please submit a request using the <u>DLLS</u> request form.

In recent months we have noticed that some students really benefit from very basic training in the use of PowerPoint for presentations and even a few minutes can reduce anxiety significantly. Our <u>presentations page</u> now includes a YouTube video covering the basics but if delivering inputs on presentation skills, our experience has been that providing an optional extra half hour on this for students who self-identify as struggling has had a significant impact on outcomes.
