
From small-scale food festivals to huge, sell-out music events – there are lots of diverse and exciting things going on in Oxfordshire throughout the year.







Apprentices are employed and receive a wage so you study while you work. At least 6 hours a week of your work time is dedicated to off-the-iob training. This will include attending university part-time and/or studying online. You'll also benefit from access to university resources such as the library and Student Services teams.

You'll gain the knowledge, skills and behaviours to confidently achieve a job role, and you'll benefit from a workplace mentor or supervisor to support you through your apprenticeship.

Oxford Brookes University offers higher and degree apprenticeships from level 5 to 7 so there are options to gain a Master's qualification too. PRE-SESSIONAL ENGLISH

Our pre-sessional English courses help you meet the language requirements of your degree and can be combined with our foundation courses.

Pre-sessional English is taught in 6-12 week blocks at different levels. You can take consecutive course blocks until you reach the level required for your degree course.

If you need IELTS 6.0 with 6.0 in reading and writing, 5.5 in speaking and listening (required for most undergraduate courses), you can see in the table below approximately how long you need to study depending on your current language level.

INTERNATIONAL FOUNDATION COURSES

EXAM RESULTS

In July, awarding bodies release examination results for the International Baccalaureate and Access to Higher Education Diploma courses. In August, BTEC, A-level, T-level and other level 3 qualification results are released.

If your offer is conditional upon obtaining certain grades in other qualifications (for example, English language tests, or other international qualifications), you must send details of your results in writing by email to the Admissions Office. If you have applied directly to us, you can upload evidence of your results directly to your applicant portal. If you have met the conditions of our offer, UCAS or the Admissions Office will provide you with confirmation of this.

If your results do not quite meet the conditions of the offer, it doesn't automatically mean that you will not be accepted. Your application will then be given further consideration.

CLEARING

While we encourage you to apply early, many of our courses have places available in Clearing. If you've made a later decision to apply, or you've changed your mind, <u>visit our</u> clearing website.

ENROLMENT

If you are an international student, you will most likely need to meet your conditions earlier in order to get your visa in time.

If you are applying to a teacher education, healthcare or social work course, you'll need to complete additional steps necessary for you to study the programme (such as Disclosure and Barring Service clearance) by the deadlines in your offer. When we know for certain that you are coming to Oxford Brookes (when you have either accepted an unconditional offer or finalised an offer after meeting the conditions) we will send you details of how to enrol online. Once you have completed enrolment, you'll be given access to our online student system.

Entry qualifications and typical offers

We welcome a wide range of qualifications for entry onto our programmes. Our admissions team will help you work out your own combination of likely grades and qualifications, which can include credit gained from previous work experience or training.



Wherever possible we make our conditional offers using the UCAS tariff. Please see page 163 for a breakdown of how to calculate your tariff score. This gives great flexibility, particularly if you are offering a mix of qualifications, such as two A-levels plus a BTEC National Extended Certificate.

In many cases, we don't specify grades to be achieved, because we are looking for achievement across a range of qualifications or subjects. For a general guide to the grades required, please look at the online course pages.

FIRST DEGREES

Our standard entry requirement is three A-levels or equivalent qualifications. In some cases, courses have specific required subjects and additional GCSE requirements. In addition to A-levels, we accept a wide range of other qualifications including:

- a BTEC National Certificate, Diploma or Extended Diploma at a good standard and in a relevant subject

- a recognised foundation course (for our international foundation courses please see page 155)

CONTEXTUAL ADMISSIONS

At Oxford Brookes University, we want to attract students from all backgrounds who have the potential to succeed.

We seek to be a fully inclusive institution that reflects society at large and provides an excellent student experience, a breadth of opportunities and successful outcomes for all students irrespective of their background.

Our Contextual Admissions policy forms part of our commitment to ensuring that all students with the potential to succeed at Oxford Brookes have equality of access.

If your main language is not English, you will need to show us that your English is at the right level to enable you to study here successfully.

To start an undergraduate degree you will need to meet our English language entry requirements as well as the required academic qualifications.

Courses require different scores within the range given, so please check individual course details on our website.

If you need a student visa to come to the UK you will need to meet the UK Visa and Immigration English language requirements.

If you do not meet the required English language level you can apply for one of our pre-sessional English courses (see page 155).

* T-levels are a relatively new qualification but are already included in the UCAS tariff. We welcome prospective students who are taking this qualification to apply. For some programmes with specific required subjects, particular subject areas or occupational specialisms may be required.



LOANS FOR FULL-TIME UK STUDENTS

You don't need to pay any tuition fees while you are at university. Instead, the government provides a tuition fee loan which you start to pay back once you leave university and are earning above £25,000* a year.

The government also provides a maintenance loan to contribute towards living costs. You start to pay this back at the same time as your tuition fee loan. Your repayments will be 9% of any income above £25,000*, so the amount you repay each month will depend on your earnings.

Examples of monthly repayments for loans covering tuition and living costs:

Repayments will be taken automatically from your salary through the tax system. If your yearly income falls below £25,000 your repayments will automatically stop. All outstanding repayments will be written off after 40 years.

PART-TIME UK STUDENTS

If you are thinking of studying part-time you will also be eligible for a loan to cover the cost of tuition and a maintenance loan for your living costs. You will only start to repay both once you have finished your course and are earning above £25,000* a year.

FOUNDATION DEGREES

If you are a full-time UK student studying for a foundation degree at the university or with one of our partner colleges you will be charged £7,570. You may then have the option of topping up to a full bachelor's degree at the same college for one year's further study, also charged at £7,570*. If you come to Oxford Brookes to top up, you will be charged £9,535*.

FIELD TRIP COSTS

The cost of any field trips that form a mandatory part of your course are included in your tuition fees. Optional field trips are not included, and you will have to pay a separate fee. Further information about additional course costs can be found on the online course pages.

BURSARIES

Oxford Brookes offers a range of bursaries and scholarships to support students. Our Brookes Bursary offers up to £1,250 per year to support your study.

NHS LEARNING SUPPORT FUND

All UK healthcare students on courses will receive government funding of at least £5,000 a year which they will not need to pay back.

GOVERNMENT SUPPORT FOR LIVING COSTS

All UK students are eligible for a maintenance loan to help cover living costs. The amount you can borrow will depend on your household income. Full-time UK students with household incomes below £25,000* are entitled to a maintenance loan of up to £10,227*.

FURTHER GOVERNMENT SUPPORT

Additional funding is available for disabled students, students with children and students with adult dependants. This funding does not need to be paid back.

*All figures quoted are for the 2025-2026 academic year and are subject to Parliamentary approval. Please note tuition fees may increase in subsequent years both for new and continuing students in line with an inflationary amount determined by the government. Tuition fees for 2026 will be published by December 2025. Other threshold figures may also change for 2026-2027. See individual course pages on our website as they become available.

International fees and funding

If you are a non-UK student it's likely you will have to pay international fees.



Fees for international students are set annually and the cost depends on the course you study. The tuition fee for one year's full-time undergraduate study in 2025-2026 will be between £16,750 and £20,800. You will receive information about how and when to pay your fees before your course starts.

TUITION FEE DEPOSITS

If you are an international student, you will need to pay a deposit to secure your place at Oxford Brookes, or provide evidence of financial sponsorship by an Oxford Brookes approved sponsor. The deposit will be between £3,000 and £8,000 and will be deducted from your first tuition fees payment.

As part of the University's plan to bring together all of its Oxford-based activity on the Headington Campus over the coming years, we will be moving all teaching from Harcourt Hill to our Headington Campus for the start of the 2025/26 academic year. As with any large estate project timescales can shift, so we will keep people informed of any changes to this plan. Further updates will also be provided on future use of services currently provided at Harcourt Hill, such as Brookes Sport and accommodation facilities. 
