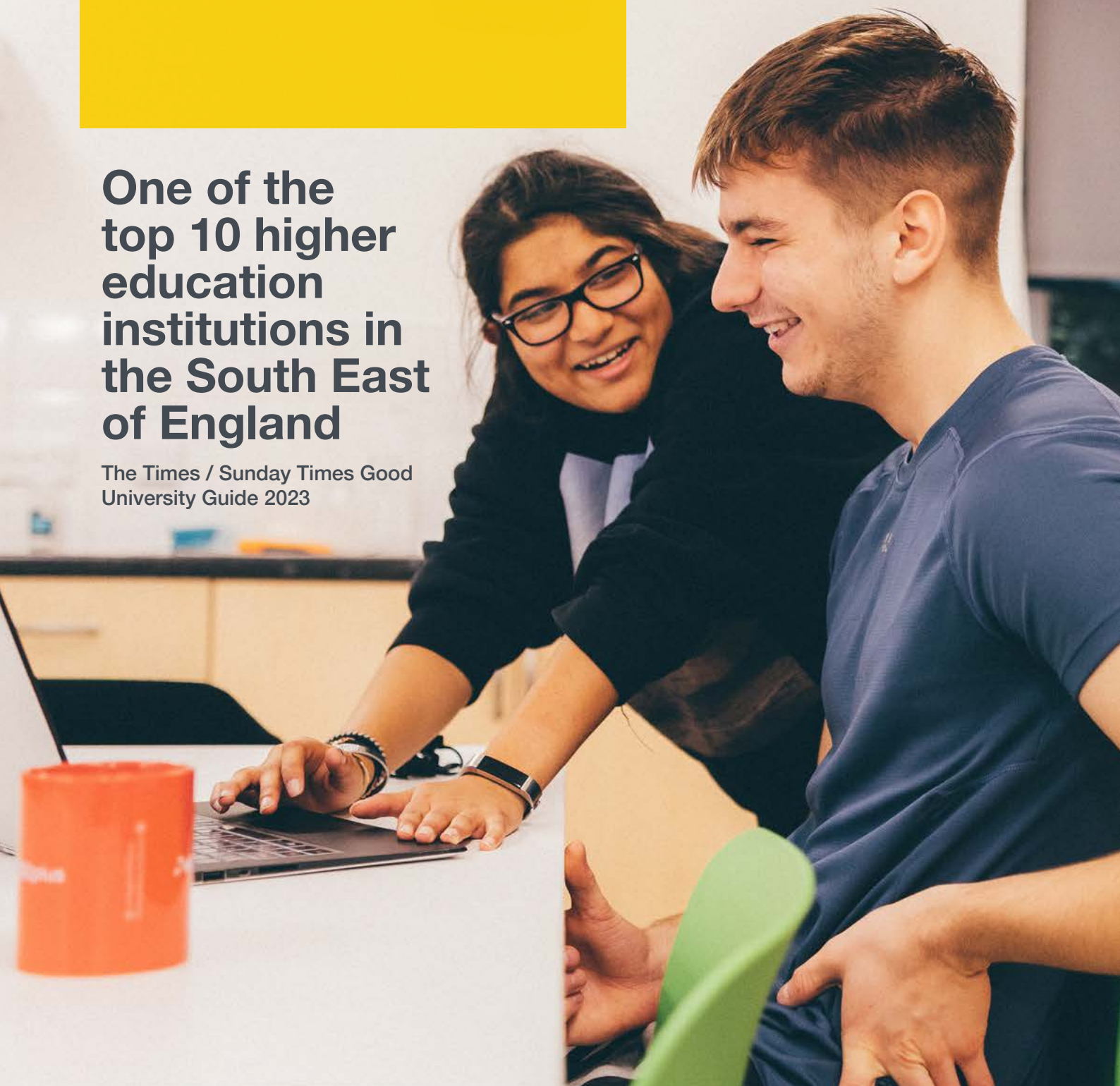

# STUDY OPTIONS

We can offer you a range of levels of study, from bachelor's and foundation degrees through to advanced study at master's and PhD level.

## INTERNATIONAL FOUNDATION

If you do not meet the minimum academic requirements for our undergraduate courses, you may still be able to apply for one of our international foundation courses. Our foundation courses provide a bridge between school study in your home country and undergraduate study, offering a guaranteed pathway to an undergraduate degree if you pass with the required grades.

## UNDERGRADUATE

A bachelor's degree will take three years to complete full-time, or four years if you opt for a work placement. You will need to have A-levels or the international equivalent.

## POSTGRADUATE

After completing your bachelor's degree, you can go on to study for a master's and specialise in an area that interests you. The course will take one or two years to complete full-time. There are usually three stages to a master's degree: Postgraduate Certificate, Postgraduate Diploma and Master's.

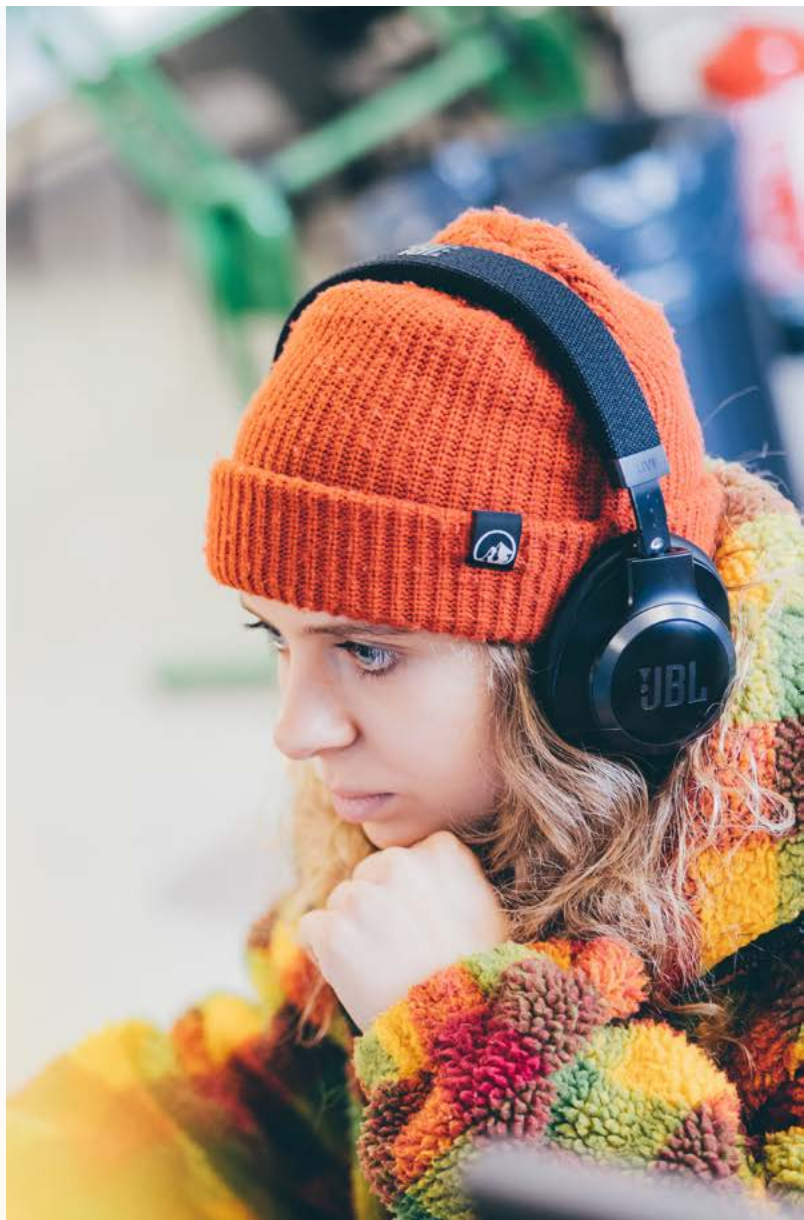
## RESEARCH DEGREES

Research at Oxford Brookes enjoys an international reputation, attracting high-quality staff and students as well as major funded projects. You can study for a Master of Philosophy (MPhil) or Doctor of Philosophy (PhD) degree and conduct original research in your subject area. As a research student at Brookes, you will join a vibrant and supportive environment, and benefit from expert supervision and a strong programme of research training.

## DISTANCE LEARNING

Our distance learning options give you the flexibility to study for a Brookes degree level qualification from your home country.

Some courses are only available through distance learning. Others include both distance learning and on-campus options, for example short study periods. Please check the details of the course you are interested in to see if it suits your needs.



### DID YOU KNOW, YOU CAN JOIN US PART-WAY THROUGH A DEGREE PROGRAMME?

Most of our courses consider applications for entry part-way through the course for students who have credit from previous learning or relevant professional experience. You can apply for undergraduate or postgraduate programmes, and with varying levels of credit or qualification. We even have a number of courses that have been specifically designed for students looking to join Oxford Brookes for the final year of their studies.

# FEES AND FINANCE

## TUITION FEES

### How much will my course cost?

Fees for international students are set annually and the cost depends on the course you study. The tuition fee for one year's full-time undergraduate study in 2024-25 will be approximately £15,950 to £18,050. The tuition fee for one year's full-time postgraduate study in 2024-25 will be approximately £16,400 to £19,400.

Please note:

- Fees are quoted for full-time study unless specified otherwise.
- Quoted fees do not include the cost of a placement year, please see our website for that information.
- Please be aware that some courses will involve some other additional costs that are not covered by your fees.

## PAYING YOUR FEES

Before your course starts you will receive information on how and when to pay your fees. For the majority of courses you can pay in two instalments. All international students will need to pay a fee deposit or provide confirmation of funding from an Oxford Brookes approved sponsor. Please check your offer letter for details.

## TUITION FEE DEPOSITS

If you are an international student, you will need to pay a deposit to secure your place at Oxford Brookes, or provide evidence of financial sponsorship by an Oxford Brookes approved sponsor. The deposit will be between £3,000 and £8,000 and will be deducted from your first tuition fees payment.

## LIVING COSTS

The amount of money you will need for living costs will depend on your course and individual level of spending. The UK Visas and Immigration service recommends you have at least £1,023 per month for living costs when studying outside of London. Living costs will vary significantly from student to student, so you should think realistically about what you spend. Postgraduate research students may also need an extra £600-£1,000 for expenses such as thesis presentations, travel and equipment for research.

As a general guide, costs to budget for include:

- accommodation in halls of residence range from £129-£236 per week
- food £40-£50 a week
- clothing, socialising and entertainment £50 a week.

# PATHWAYS

Oxford Brookes international pathways courses will help you to prepare for undergraduate or postgraduate study, and give you a great introduction to university life. You will be taught by highly qualified and experienced academic staff. They are specialists in English for Academic Purposes who have trained, taught and researched overseas and in the UK.

## PRE-SESSIONAL ENGLISH

Our pre-sessional English courses help you meet the language requirements of your undergraduate or postgraduate degree. Even if your current English qualifications are high enough, you may choose to take this course to boost your confidence in English (writing, reading, listening and speaking) before starting your degree. Pre-sessional English is taught in 12 week blocks at four different levels. You can take consecutive course blocks until you reach the level required for your degree course. The tables below show approximately how long you need to study depending on your current and required language level.

### Which level of pre-sessional English should I take?

If you need IELTS 6.0 with 6.0 in reading and writing, 5.5 in speaking and listening (required for most undergraduate courses):

## PRE-MASTER'S COURSES

If you do not meet the minimum academic requirements for our postgraduate courses, you may still be able to apply for one of our Pre-Master's programmes. These courses are designed to develop your subject knowledge, study skills and academic language level in preparation for your Master's degree. You can choose from one or two semesters depending on your needs.

## ENGLISH LANGUAGE

If English is not your first language then you will need to show that your English language skills are at a high enough level to succeed in your studies. Your academic qualifications may show us this.

The entry requirement for your course will be expressed as an IELTS level and refers to the IELTS Academic version of this test. You will need at least IELTS 6.0, with a minimum of 5.5 in all areas – speaking, listening, reading, writing.

Please note that courses require different scores, so please check individual course details on our website. If you need a student visa to come to the UK you will need to meet the UK Visa and Immigration English language requirements.

## After applying: what to do next

### ACCEPT YOUR OFFER

For direct applications, if you applied directly to the University, all information about your offer will be sent to you by our admissions team. You will need to reply directly to the University by the deadline given in order to accept your place.

For UCAS applications, once every university that you have applied to has made their decision, UCAS will ask you to choose your 'firm acceptance' (your first choice) and your 'insurance acceptance' (your second or backup choice).

You must make your decision by the deadline UCAS gives you, otherwise your offers will be declined automatically.

### PAY YOUR DEPOSIT

All international students will need to pay a deposit between £3,000 and £8,000 to secure their place at Oxford Brookes, or provide evidence of financial sponsorship by an Oxford Brookes approved sponsor.

Even if you have indicated the acceptance of your place through our portal or through UCAS, you will still need to pay your deposit in order to secure it.

### APPLY FOR ACCOMMODATION

You will be able to apply for a place in our halls of residence once you have accepted your offer. You will be sent an email from our Accommodation Bureau, inviting you to apply.

### MEET YOUR CONDITIONS

Most applicants will receive a conditional offer. This means that we would like to offer you a place on your chosen course, but we do not yet have sufficient information from you to confirm that place. Your offer letter will clearly state the conditions of your offer.

Once you have met any of the conditions for your course, you should send proof immediately to our admissions team at [admissions@brookes.ac.uk](mailto:admissions@brookes.ac.uk). Direct applicants can upload their evidence directly to their portal.

When you have met all the conditions of your offer you will receive an unconditional offer and your place at Oxford Brookes University will be guaranteed.

### APPLY FOR YOUR VISA

There is a lot to do when preparing for university. One of the most important things is getting your CAS (Confirmation of Acceptance for Studies) from us. You need a CAS so that you can get your Student Visa to study in the UK.

At Oxford Brookes we have a dedicated Applicant Compliance Team who can support you through the CAS process. You will hear from us with details of how to access your CAS Shield account. CAS Shield allows you to upload all the vital information and documents that we will need to issue your CAS. You'll also be able to view live updates on your CAS Shield profile.
