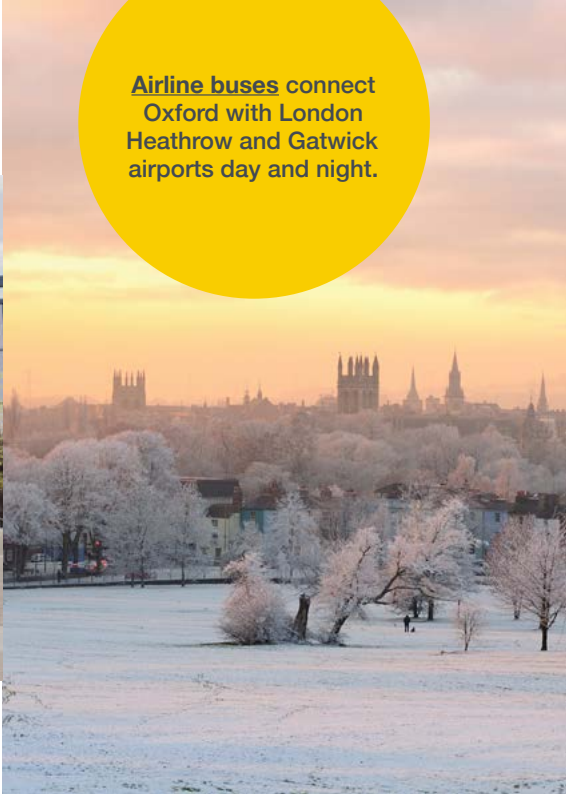

Support, mental health and wellbeing

You'll be supported from day one to help you make the most of your time with us.

STUDENT SUPPORT CO-ORDINATORS

Student support co-ordinators are a great first point of contact for navigating university life. They can provide you with support on personal issues as well as offering advice and guidance on academic matters.

STUDENT WELFARE ADVICE

The Student Welfare and Support Advice Team offers advice and support to students in crisis or who are experiencing serious circumstances that are affecting their studies. They offer short-term emotional and practical support, and can signpost to other services, with the aim of enabling students to find ways of managing the situation and moving forward.

COUNSELLING

Oxford Brookes Counselling Service works with around 1,000 students a year and we offer therapy for a wide range of circumstances including anxiety, depression, bereavement, sexuality and managing transitions at university. We have counsellors available online and in person and you can access up to six sessions per academic year.



CHAPLAINCY

The Multifaith Chaplaincy offers spiritual and pastoral care for the University community. We offer a range of events, including regular worship and religious services and social events. Our service is open to students and staff from any background, of any identity, and any faith or belief system.

INCLUSIVE SUPPORT SERVICE

The Inclusive Support Service provides individually tailored advice, tutoring and mentoring and assistive technology for disabled students. If you are neurodivergent or have a sensory or long-term physical or mental health condition, our specialist team will work with you to develop an Inclusive Support Plan (ISP) detailing the adjustments you need for teaching delivery, assessed coursework and exams. We can help you to access funding to support your studies through the Disabled Students' Allowance if you are eligible.

ACADEMIC SUPPORT

Studying with us won't always be easy, but we are with you every step of the way. Your personal academic advisor will work with you through your studies from beginning to end. They are there to support your learning and help you to get the most from your course.

You'll also have access to a range of other academic support services to help you along the way, such as the Centre for Academic Development.

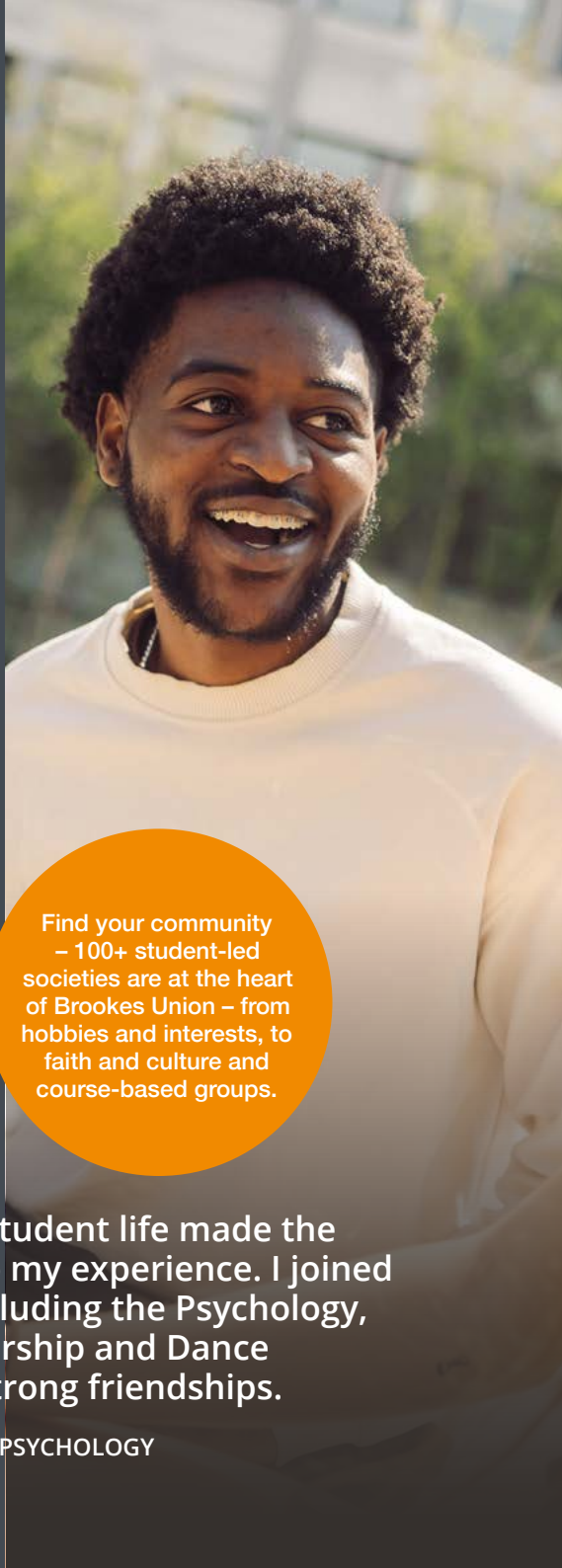

TUITION FEES AND DEPOSITS

Tuition fees for international students are reviewed annually and vary depending on your chosen course. For the 2027-28 academic year, tuition fees are expected to be:

- Undergraduate (full-time): approximately £18,500-£20,800 per year
- Postgraduate (full-time): approximately £18,200-£22,500 per year

International students are required to pay a tuition fee deposit to confirm their place. Full details of the deposit amount and payment process will be included in your offer letter.

Pre-sessional English is taught in 6-12 week blocks at different levels. You can take consecutive course blocks until you reach the level required for your degree course.

International Foundation

If you do not meet the minimum academic requirements for our undergraduate courses, you may still be able to apply for one of our international foundation courses. Our foundation courses provide a bridge between school study in your home country and undergraduate study, offering a guaranteed pathway to an undergraduate degree if you pass with required grades.

We also offer a range of integrated foundation year options, with a foundation year built into your undergraduate course. Information can be found on our website.

Pre-Master's

If you do not meet the minimum academic requirements for our postgraduate courses, you may still be able to apply for one of our Pre-Master's programmes. These courses are designed to develop your subject knowledge, study skills and academic language level in preparation for your master's degree. You can choose from one or two semesters depending on your needs.

There are various ways to apply to study with us as an international student. The application process will vary depending on the type of course you are applying for.



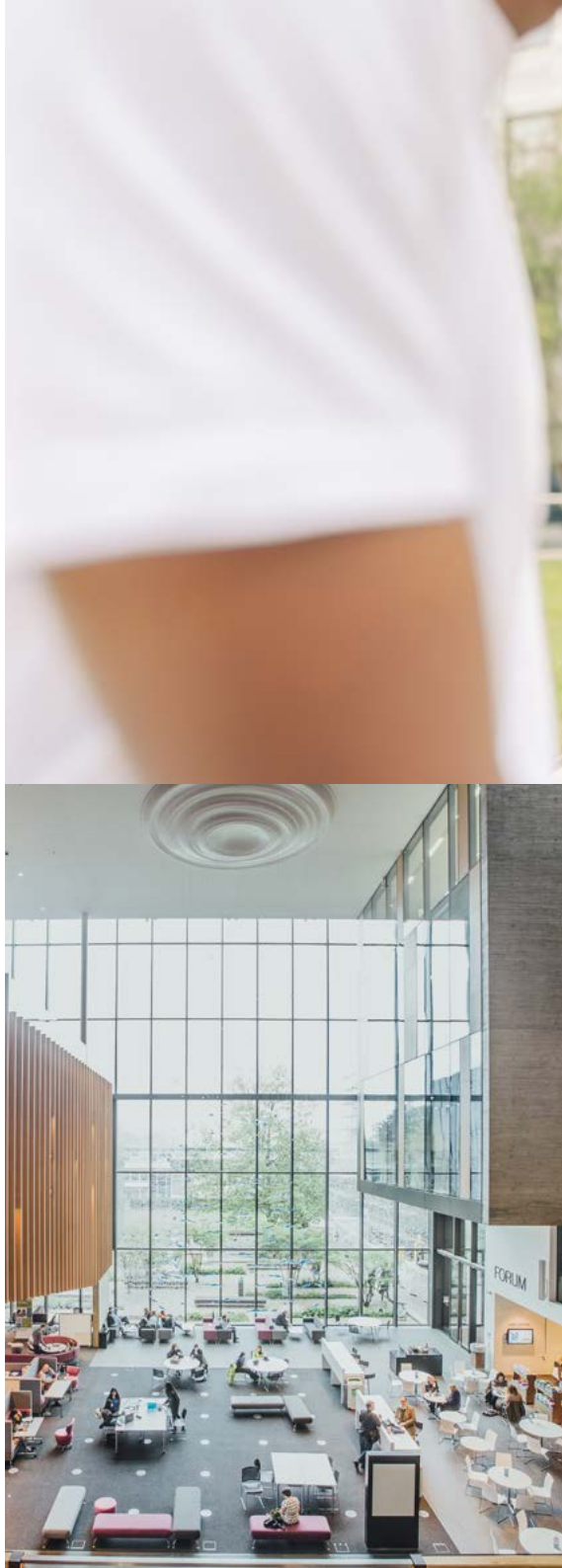

Entry requirements

If you hold qualifications which are not from the UK, please check our country/region webpages for an overview of qualification equivalencies. If you still have questions, our Global Recruitment team is happy to help – you can find their contact details on our website.

English language

If English is not your first language then you will need to show that your English language skills are at a high enough level to succeed in your studies. Your academic qualifications may show us this.

Entry requirements are expressed as an IELTS level (relating to the IELTS Academic version of the test). Most courses require at least IELTS 6.0, with no less than 5.5 in each skill. Some courses may have different requirements, so please check the specific course page on our website. If you need a student visa, you must also meet the UK Visa and Immigration (UKVI) English language requirements.

The University accepts a wide range of English language qualifications.
