#### Inclusive Assessment workshop

A <u>University Alliance research project into inclusive assessment</u> in which Oxford Brookes was a partner has recently concluded. The project aimed to identify which policies and practices implemented during the COVID-19 pandemic had positively affected awarding and continuation gaps, and whether these practices could be applied to a post-pandemic assessment environment.

The findings of the project will be disseminated and discussed during this interactive workshop led by Adrian Wallbank (PLESE, OCAED) and Annie Hughes (Head of the Learning and Teaching Enhancement Centre, Kingston University) with the objectives of helping attendees to:

- Gain practical insight into effective inclusive practices;

## GenAl Update: Safe and secure use of Al

Al models and software tools offer exciting time-saving affordances for academic practice and professional service. However, they might store, use or distribute data uploaded to them. This means they are not safe and secure, or <u>GDPR compliant</u>.

When using AI tools, beware of uploading any sensitive, confidential or protected data.

#### Ask yourself these guiding questions:

- 1. Do I fully understand the data protection and privacy settings on this AI tool?
- 2. What data, in my prompts and in what I upload, am I giving them?
- 3. Do I have the right to give it to them, is it my information and not someone else's?
- 4. Am I happy for them to store, use and share this data with others?
- 5. Will sharing this data lead to harm or impact on mine or someone's freedoms and rights?

Brookes has taken a strategic approach to enhancing <u>Academic Advising</u>, we aim to enhance practice, increase student engagement, and mitigate any risk associated with student wellbeing. OCAED's objective is to work with Academic Advisors in developing the academic practice of Advising.

For all those with Advising responsibilities, completion of a course on essential Academic Advising practices is a University requirement. If you have not already done so, please complete the online asynchronous <u>Academic Advising course</u> on Staff Learning. If you are a Stage 1 EXPLORE participant, you may have attended a taught synchronous "Introduction to Academic Advising" workshop in September 2023 or January 2024. If so, you are exempt from this course.

To help Advisors pre-empt student enquiries, <u>email templates</u> directing students to appropriate advice and guidance for specific times in the academic year are useful.

## Writing Hub: Write Space Writing Retreats

Is it challenging for you to find the right time and right place to get on with some writing? This year the Writing Hub is offering six writing retreats, four on campus and two online, between May and July. All retreats take place from 9am - 4pm with an option for half-day attendance for the online retreats.

Whether face-to-face or online the format is the same: writers of any style and level create a sense of community containing plenty of quiet space to make progress with your writing. The group reflects together on the writing process at intervals, and there will be a Centre for Academic Development tutor available to talk through any aspect of your writing with.

In participants' words, Write Space is a *stimulating*, *calm*, *good-spirited*, *constructive* and *productive* place to work; you might also get ideas for how to start a writing group yourself, as some have.

The retreats are open to all Brookes staff and students, and you can book to attend.

The Writing Hub is also promoting a 2-day Summer Writing Retreat run by the Migration and Refugees Network which is open to all.
