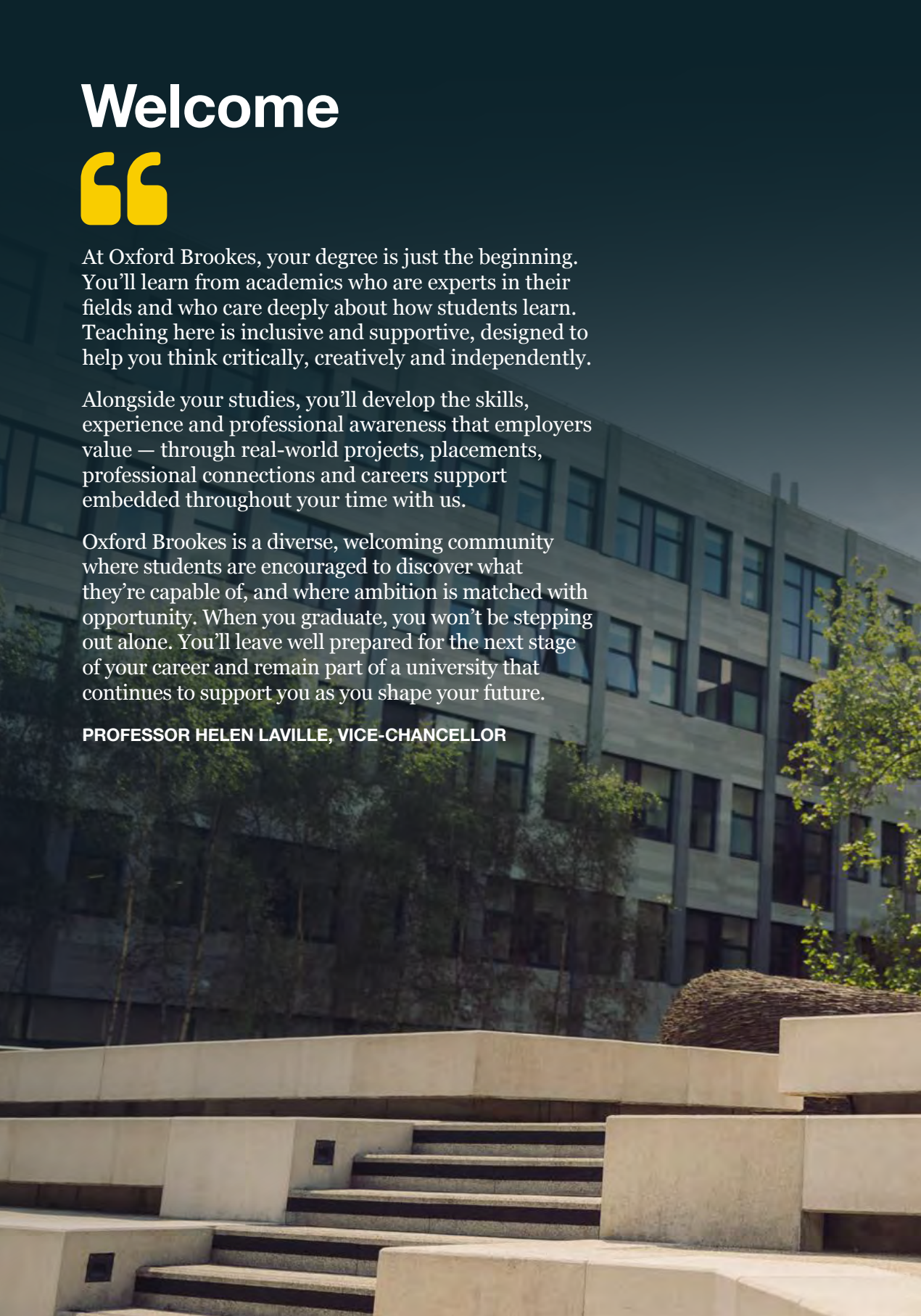

But we'll provide an abundance of opportunities so that you feel safe and supported while you explore new ground.



Support, mental health and wellbeing

Starting university is an exciting time and also a time of great change. You'll be supported from day one to help you make the most of your time with us.

You will have access to a wide range of support services to help you thrive both personally and academically:

STUDENT SUPPORT CO-ORDINATORS

Student support co-ordinators are a great first point of contact for navigating university life. They can provide you with support on personal issues as well as offering advice and guidance on academic matters.

STUDENT WELFARE ADVICE

The Student Welfare and Support Advice Team offers advice and support to students in crisis or who are experiencing serious circumstances that are affecting their studies. They offer short-term emotional and practical support, and can signpost to other services, with the aim of enabling students to find ways of managing the situation and moving forward.

COUNSELLING

Oxford Brookes Counselling Service works with around 1,000 students a year and we offer therapy for a wide range of circumstances including anxiety, depression, bereavement, sexuality and managing transitions at university. We have counsellors available online and in person and you can access up to six sessions per academic year.

CHAPLAINCY

The Multifaith Chaplaincy offers spiritual and pastoral care for the University community. We offer a range of events, including regular worship and religious services and social events. Our service is open to students and staff from any background, of any identity, and any faith or belief system.

INCLUSIVE SUPPORT SERVICE

The Inclusive Support Service provides individually tailored advice, tutoring and mentoring and assistive technology for disabled students. If you are neurodivergent or have a sensory or long-term physical or mental health condition, our specialist team will work with you to develop an Inclusive Support Plan (ISP) detailing the adjustments you need for teaching delivery, assessed coursework and exams. We can help you to access funding to support your studies through the Disabled Students' Allowance if you are eligible.

ACADEMIC SUPPORT

Studying with us won't always be easy, but we are with you every step of the way. Your personal academic advisor will work with you through your studies from beginning to end. They are there to support your learning and help you to get the most from your course.

Our pathways courses are designed to get international students onto their degree feeling prepared, confident and excited.



PRE-SESSIONAL ENGLISH

Our pre-sessional English courses help you meet the language requirements of your degree and can be combined with our foundation courses.

Pre-sessional English is taught in 6-12 week blocks at different levels.

If you need IELTS 6.0 with 6.0 in reading and writing, 5.5 in speaking and listening (required for most undergraduate courses), you can see in the table below approximately how long you need to study depending on your current language level.

You can apply for entry in September 2027 or for deferred entry in September 2028. Some of our courses also have a January intake, and you can find further information on the course pages of our website.

If you're applying for full-time study between September 2027 and September 2028, you should apply via UCAS and we encourage you to make sure you submit your application by their deadlines.

If you're applying for part-time study, you can apply directly to Oxford Brookes. **For more information on applying directly.**

INTERNATIONAL APPLICATIONS

International applicants can either apply through UCAS or directly to the university. **Please see our website for application deadlines.**

EXAM RESULTS

In July, awarding bodies release examination results for the International Baccalaureate and Access to Higher Education Diploma courses. In August, BTEC, A-level, T-level and other level 3 qualification results are released.

If your offer is conditional upon obtaining certain grades in other qualifications (for example, English language tests, or other international qualifications), you must send details of your results in writing by email to the Admissions Office. If you have applied directly to us, you can upload evidence of your results directly to your applicant portal. If you have met the conditions of our offer, UCAS or the Admissions Office will provide you with confirmation of this.

If your results do not quite meet the conditions of the offer, it doesn't automatically mean that you will not be accepted. Your application will then be given further consideration.

CLEARING

While we encourage you to apply early, many of our courses have places available in Clearing. If you've made a later decision to apply, or you've changed your mind, **visit our clearing webpage.**

You can **get in touch with UCAS** for more information about the Clearing system.

ENROLMENT

If you are an international student, you will most likely need to meet your conditions earlier in order to get your visa in time.

If you are applying to a teacher education, healthcare or social work course, you'll need to complete additional steps necessary for you to study the programme (such as Disclosure and Barring Service clearance) by the deadlines in your offer. We'll explain this in the online course page for the courses you are interested in.

When we know for certain that you are coming to Oxford Brookes (when you have either accepted an unconditional offer or finalised an offer after meeting the conditions) we will send you details of how to enrol online. Once you have completed enrolment, you'll be given access to our online student system.

Entry qualifications and typical offers

We welcome a wide range of qualifications for entry onto our programmes. Our admissions team will help you work out your own combination of likely grades and qualifications, which can include credit gained from previous work experience or training.



Wherever possible we make our conditional offers using the UCAS tariff. Please see page 163 for a breakdown of how to calculate your tariff score. This gives great flexibility, particularly if you are offering a mix of qualifications, such as two A-levels plus a BTEC National Extended Certificate.

In many cases, we don't specify grades to be achieved, because we are looking for achievement across a range of qualifications or subjects. For a general guide to the grades required, please look at the online course pages.

FIRST DEGREES

Our standard entry requirement is three A-levels or equivalent qualifications. In some cases, courses have specific required subjects and additional GCSE requirements.

In addition to A-levels, we accept a wide range of other qualifications including:

- the Welsh Baccalaureate
- the Access to Higher Education Diploma
- a BTEC National Certificate, Diploma or Extended Diploma at a good standard and in a relevant subject
- the International Baccalaureate Diploma
- Scottish qualifications – five subjects in SCE with two at Higher level or one at Advanced Higher level, or three subjects in Scottish Highers or two at Advanced Higher level

Courses require different scores within the range given, so please check individual course details on our website.

At Oxford Brookes there are several options available to support you in funding your studies. Our course fees for UK students are £10,050 a year.



LOANS FOR FULL-TIME UK STUDENTS

You don't need to pay any tuition fees while you are at university. Instead, the government provides a tuition fee loan which you start to pay back once you leave university and are earning above £25,000* a year.

The government also provides a maintenance loan to contribute towards living costs. You start to pay this back at the same time as your tuition fee loan. Your repayments will be 9% of any income above £25,000*, so the amount you repay each month will depend on your earnings.

Examples of monthly repayments for loans covering tuition and living costs:

Salary	Monthly repayments
£25,000	£0
£30,000	£37
£35,000	£75
£40,000	£112

Repayments will be taken automatically from your salary through the tax system. If your yearly income falls below £25,000 your repayments will automatically stop. All outstanding repayments will be written off after 40 years.

PART-TIME UK STUDENTS

If you are thinking of studying part-time you will also be eligible for a loan to cover the cost of tuition and a maintenance loan for your living costs. You will only start to repay both once you have finished your course and are earning above £25,000* a year.

FOUNDATION DEGREES

If you are a full-time UK student studying for a foundation degree at the university or with one of our partner colleges you will be charged £7,700*. You may then have the option of topping up to a full bachelor's degree at the same college for one year's further study, also charged at £7,700*. If you come to Oxford Brookes to top up, you will be charged £10,050.

FIELD TRIP COSTS

The cost of any field trips that form a mandatory part of your course are included in your tuition fees. Optional field trips are not included, and you will have to pay a separate fee. Further information about additional course costs can be found on the online course pages.

BURSARIES

Oxford Brookes offers a range of bursaries and scholarships to support students. Our Brookes Bursary offers up to £1,250 per year to support your study.

NHS LEARNING SUPPORT FUND

All UK healthcare students on courses will receive government funding of at least £5,000 a year which they will not need to pay back.

GOVERNMENT SUPPORT FOR LIVING COSTS

All UK students are eligible for a maintenance loan to help cover living costs. The amount you can borrow will depend on your household income. Full-time UK students with household incomes below £25,000 are entitled to a maintenance loan of up to £10,830*.

FURTHER GOVERNMENT SUPPORT

Additional funding is available for disabled students, students with children and students with adult dependants. This funding does not need to be paid back.

**All figures quoted are for the 2027-2028 academic year. Please note tuition fees may increase in subsequent years both for new and continuing students in line with an inflationary amount determined by the government. Maintenance loan thresholds will be published by the government in early 2027.*

International fees and funding

If you are a non-UK student it's likely you will have to pay international fees.



Fees for international students are set annually and the cost depends on the course you study. The tuition fee for one year's full-time undergraduate study in 2026-2027 will be between £17,250 to £19,700. You will receive information about how and when to pay your fees before your course starts.

TUITION FEE DEPOSITS

If you are an international student, you will need to pay a deposit to secure your place at Oxford Brookes, or provide evidence of financial sponsorship by an Oxford Brookes-approved sponsor.

Some applicants will be asked to pay a top-up deposit before receiving their CAS (Confirmation of Acceptance for Studies). All deposit payments will be deducted from your tuition fees.

COURSE FEES AND ADDITIONAL COSTS

Our tuition fees cover your first attempt at all modules necessary to complete the academic year of your programme and any field trips that form a mandatory part of your course. Tuition fees are payable annually.

Further costs may be incurred by you, including:

- equipment and core textbooks
- bench fees and consumables
- DBS checks
- printing
- uniform or protective clothing
- subsistence, travel and accommodation
- costs for field trips or work placements and, where these involve overseas travel, health and public liability insurance (unless explicitly stated that these are included in course fees)
- professional body membership fees
- optional graduation-related costs such as gown hire, guest tickets, official photographs
- additional modules
- module retakes.

Many programmes include optional field trips and work placements, where participation is encouraged, but is not required to evidence module or programme learning outcomes, and will not disadvantage you should you not be able to take part. These optional activities are at additional cost to you.

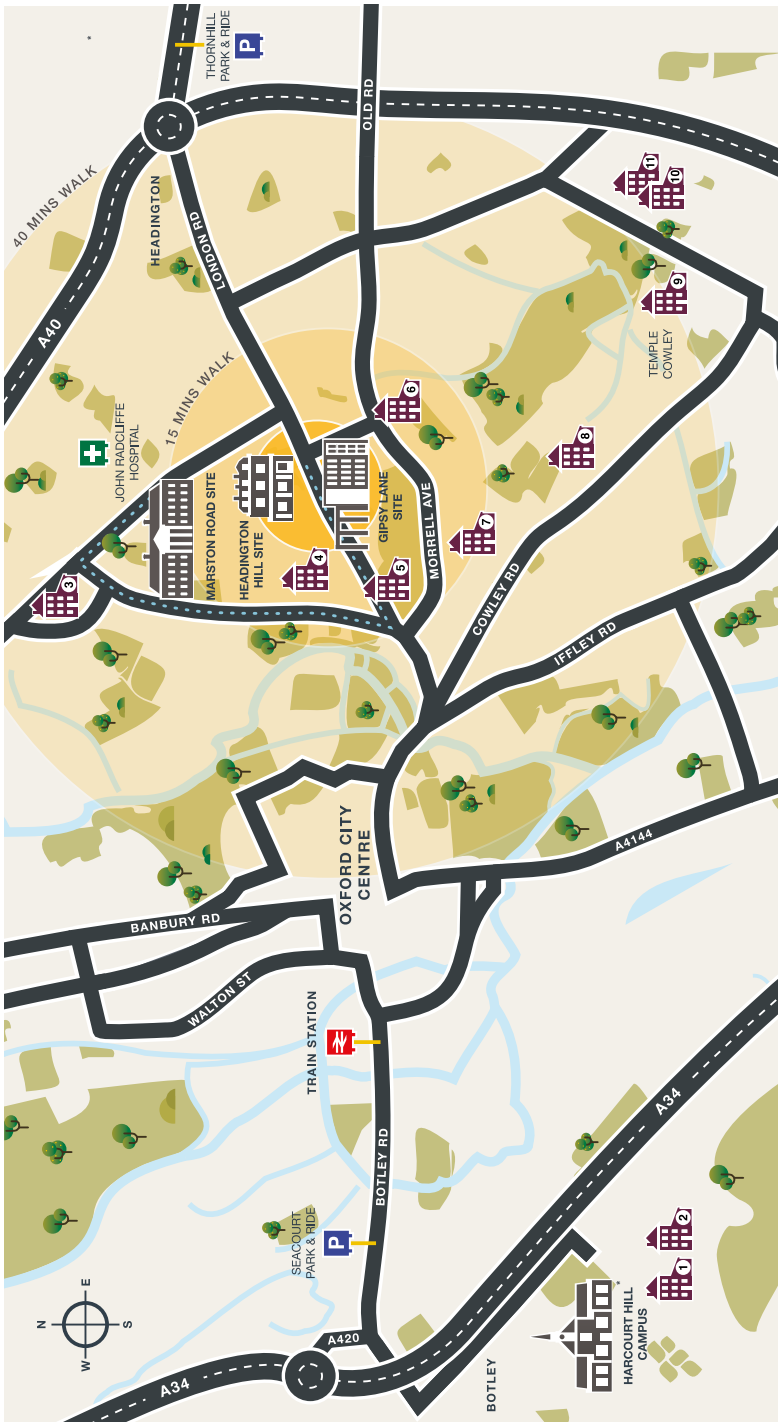
